- ✓ The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) provides three to four days of shelf-stable products, along with a grocery cart of nutritious food, including fresh produce and protein.
- ✓ Our Baby Emergency Food Box Program provides formula or food for children up to 12 months of age; diapers are provided when available. Proof of age/birth certificate is required.
- ✓ As available, the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) provides shelf-stable food and fresh groceries for seniors aged 60 years and older who live in the Desert Mission Food Bank service area and meet federal poverty-level guidelines.
- ✓ Community Nutrition Education programs offer classes, nutritious recipes, on-site and community cooking demonstrations and Farm Stand events held at HonorHealth medical centers.
- ✓ The Garden Program encourages growing fresh, healthy fruits and vegetables on-site and in the community. Free fall and spring gardening classes are available.
